What do you call Robin Hood in reverse -- stealing from the poor to give to the rich? It is called eminent domain abuse. Eminent domain allows the government to appropriate property for public use, such as for building roads or dams. Property owners are supposed to be given just compensation when their property is taken. But now, all across the country, **eminent domain is being used to deprive people of their land to be sold to private developers.**



The flimsy justification for this act of **outright robbery** is to increase the tax base of the area, providing more revenue for the government. The personal devastation caused by this act is enormous. Individuals and families have been forced out of their lifetime homes and have lost their livelihoods.

The more than 6,000 members of the Free State Project have committed to move to New Hampshire to get active for smaller government. If you are fed up with government encroachments on our rights, then please consider relocating to New Hampshire, a freedom-friendly, low-tax state with a strong economy and high quality of life.

New Hampshire is one of the few states in the nation with no cases of eminent domain use for private gain. A 1980 New Hampshire Supreme Court decision ruled that condemnations for 'economic development' were unconstitutional.
